**Daniel Harding** has kindly agreed to conduct the Berlin Philharmonic on the following evening, in a programme that has been modified.

As announced, Tabea Zimmermann will perform as the soloist in Alfred Schnittke's Concerto for Viola and Orchestra. Daniel Harding has chosen the Symphony No. 4 in E-flat-major by Anton Bruckner for the second half of the concert.
