The Salzburg Festival Society in New York celebrates its 20th anniversary with a sold-out fundraising gala featuring the artists Asmik Grigorian and Jonathan Tetelman

The Salzburg Festival Society, the American association of Friends of the Festival, celebrated its 20th anniversary in its hometown of New York.

Over the years, the great American tradition of private philanthropy has played a decisive role in enabling the Salzburg Festival to implement artistic projects and create spaces such as the SalzburgKulisse at the Haus für Mozart, which would have been impossible without this help.

The Salzburg Festival Society is led by Elisabeth Muhr (Chairman) and Nabil Chartouni (President), both active Salzburg Festival Society members for the past 20 years.

150 guests from the world of culture, business and society attended the event at the exclusive Union Club in Manhattan; the gala was quickly sold out.

The musical highlight of the evening was a performance by **Jonathan Tetelman**, one of the most sought-after tenors of our time. He delighted the Friends in New York City with arias from the operas *Tosca* by Giacomo Puccini, *Fedora* by Umberto Giordano and *Carmen* by Georges Bizet, as well as the zarzuela *La tabernera del Puerto* by Pablo Sorozábal.

Jonathan Tetelman was accompanied at the piano by Israel Gursky.

The celebrated soprano **Asmik Grigorian** was the special guest of the gala evening.

Both singers will perform in Salzburg in the new production of Georges Bizet's *Carmen* this summer.
